Egypt is situated in the northeast corner of Africa.

The Ancient Egyptian Civilisation was one of the world's first civilisation. The ancient Egyptians build huge pyramids, temples, palaces and tombs.

The river Nile is more than six thousand five hundred kilometres in length and it passes through elven modern countries.

The river Nile provided ancient Egypt with fertile soil and water for irrigation, as well as a means to transporting materials for building projects.

Daily life in ancient Egypt revolved around the Nile and the fertile land along its banks. The yearly flooding of the Nile enriched the soil and brought good harvests and wealth to the land.

The Ancient Egyptians build pyramids as giant burial tombs for the most important people in their society, the pharaohs.

Inside each of the pyramid is a mummy.
