

World Book Day





World book day is on Thursday 2nd March

On this day, children are invited to dress up as a character from a book. We know that dressing up is not something everyone likes to do and therefore it is not compulsory and children are more than welcome to wear their school uniform instead.

During the day, all children will gather together to read a whole school book followed by activities in class. There will be many opportunities for the children to listen to books being read, read aloud and also buddy read with children in their house teams.

Swimming



Monday 27th February marks the start of swimming for this year.

Year 4 will have their block of swimming lessons to start. Mr Kitchinson who is a qualified swimming teacher, will accompany the Y4 pupils to the lessons.

Boys are to wear trunks or thigh or knee length swim shorts. They must be skin-tight (no flappy parts) with no pockets. Girls need to wear a normal one-piece swimsuit. For those with mid/long hair, a swim cap preferably should be worn, failing that, a tight bun on the top of the head with no hair dangling in the water. No earrings/jewellery.

The children will be going on the coach after morning break and returning in time for lunch. At this stage, the staff that are accompanying the children are: Mr Kitchinson (year 5 teacher), Miss Francis, and Mrs Kelly.

If the child wishes to use goggles, the consent form (which was previously sent) needs to be completed.

The changing rooms are single sex and there are private cubicles also available.

The children's abilities will be assessed and they will be placed into groups by fully trained swimming teachers by ability. At no time will the children be out of their depth if the teachers deem it not safe.

The abilities of the children is very broad (as always) so there is no need for any child to worry about their lack of experience.
