Thank you for everyone's wonderful efforts with your child's attendance. Here is the class attendance from 1st Sept- 19th Oct 2023:

It is fantastic to see how happy and eager our children are to start the school day, such a wonderful atmosphere. Again, we are so grateful for everyone's effort with punctuality as this really does help to settle your child into the school day.

Below is a table of how school absence could affect your pupil's ability to access the curriculum.

Above 97%	Above 97%. Less than 6 days' absence a year: Excellent attendancel Pupils with this attendance should have access to the majority of the taught curriculum.
95% and below	95%. Less than 10 days' absence in a year: Attendance needs to improve! Pupils with this attendance are likely to access the majority curriculum but will miss out on important educational experiences.
90%	90%. 19 days' absence over the year: Pupils with this attendance are missing 1 month of school per year and will miss key curriculum areas; it will be difficult for them to achieve their best.
85%	85%, 29 days' absence in a year: These pupils are missing <u>6 weeks</u> of school per year, it will be very difficult for them to access the curriculum and achieve their best.
80% or below	80%. Pupils with this attendance are missing the equivalent of <u>1 day for every week</u> of school. It will be almost impossible to access all of the curriculum.

Admissions to secondary school

Year 6 Parents — Secondary Applications For parents of pupils in Year 6,

The time has arrived for you to begin the process of applying for a secondary school place. It is absolutely essential that all applications are made to your home Local Authority by the national closing date of Tuesday 31st October, 2023. Nottinghamshire applications can be made here.

Nottinghamshire County Council have produced this factsheet to make the process easier for you. For the overwhelming majority of you who will be applying for a place at All Saints', please note that you must complete a Supplementary Form from All Saints' as well as the Local Authority application form. Information on admissions to All Saints' can be found here: https://www.allsaints.notts.sch.uk/information/admissions/.

If you are having any difficulties, please speak to a member of our office team, who will be only too happy to help. It is important to note that if a late application is made, then this will not be considered until all other applications have been allocated; this means you may not be allocated a place in your preferred choice of school.

OLOL 'Little Acts of kindness Fund'

Little Acts of Kindness In order to support our families with the rise in the cost of living, the Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Multi-Academy Trust has a 'Little Acts of Kindness Fund' to offer financial support for all registered pupils who attend a Trust school. The Fund supplements families who need support in paying for: ② Curriculum trips and residential visits; ③ Other educational visits and trips;

- School uniform, shoes or sports/PE kit;
- School meals;
- Educational equipment;
- Travel to and from school;

Please note that all payments are discretionary and if awarded, do not need to be repaid. Pupils may be eligible for grants from the fund if: household income is below £25,000; a pupil whose parents are currently claiming other means-tested benefits including: Income Support, Working Tax Credit/ Child Tax Credit, Income Based Employment and Support Allowance (ESA), Universal Credit – who is not entitled to free school meals; or at the decision of the Headteacher or the Trust's Head of Finance,

any pupil who does not fall under the categories listed above, but consider themselves to be in financial hardship. Further details of the Little Acts of Kindness Fund can be found here along with the Application Form which can be downloaded to apply.

Inspire Libraries Maths development

Inspire Libraries have an exciting opportunity taking place at St Patrick's in January. They are offering a free course for parents/carers on how to support Key Stage 2 Maths.
