Hello everyone.

The PTA would like to keep everyone updated with our fundraising so far this school year as well as our upcoming events.

The first fundraiser of the year was our preloved toy and book sale. We are pleased to announce that we raised £47.55 on this event. Many thanks for all your donations and any remaining books will be available at the Christmas market. More information later.

Advent is a busy time in school with lots of fundraising opportunities and fun for the children. This starts next Friday 1st December with our non-uniform day in exchange for a selection box. The chocolate will then be used for fund raising opportunities at the Christmas Fair.

The children have been asking for a school disco for some time. We have arranged for a school disco after school on 4th December. Key stage 1 and Foundation will start at 4pm and finish at 5.15pm. Parents will be required to stay with their children throughout this. Key Stage 2 will be from 5.15 pm to 6.30pm. The cost is £5 per child and this includes admission as well as a drink, crisps and sweets. Money for tickets can be sent into school in an envelope with the child's name and year group labelled 'School Disco'. There will be additional items to buy at the disco but children should only bring a small amount of change with them.

On Friday 8th December in the afternoon, we will be holding our Christmas Fair where parents are invited to join us to celebrate Christmas. There will be a number of stalls and activities ongoing in the school hall. Further details on times will follow in the school newsletter. If anyone has any tombola prizes or gift bags they would be able to donate then please drop these at the school office.

The ever-popular St Patricks School Calendar is in the design process and will be available to purchase before the Christmas break. They make excellent Christmas presents. Priced at £4. An order form will be sent out in the next week. Make sure you order early to give us much time as possible to make up sufficient before we finish,

We will also be in attendance at the nativity plays with our normal raffles and maybe the odd auction for a little bit of fun.

Its important that we stress that every penny which we raise goes back to our children. This year we have set our first target to raise a sum of £5,000. We are currently discussing with school how best to spend this. We have already purchased books worth in excess of £900 for years 4, 5 and 6 and committed to additional expenditure in the region of another £600.

We are very lucky as a school that our Catholic Multi Academy Trust are very supportive with the funding which they provide to us. However, they are unable to fund everything with school budgets tight. Therefore, the funding we provide to school will allow for the additional extras which support the children and our teaching staff. In addition, our events allow us to bring our school community together and we hope that once the summer arrives the weather will allow us to do this more.

In the new year we have the following events planned:-

January – Clothes Collection – Make sure you save your unwanted clothes as we can get cash for them.

February – Poppet Box Challenge – The children can earn money for doing jobs around the house over half term and fill their Poppet boxes full of small change.

March – The St. Patricks Gold Cup Race Night – More details to follow in the new year but dress up for a fun evening of horse racing in the comfort of the school hall. Celebrate St. Patricks Day with the thrills of a night at the races.

July – Our annual summer fair. Hopefully a lovely day will allow us to enjoy some fun outside on the school field with lots of stalls and games to play.





Trust Capital Projects

Development of a sensory room and the staff room

Throughout this term, school building works will start on a number of projects which will further enhance the quality of our learning environment. Underneath the canopy will be made into a compound for the building equipment and will therefore be made secure and out of use. There will additionally be a skip near the Y2 and Y4 classrooms. We would appreciate you making sure that your children are kept away from these areas at the end of the day. These projects include renovation of a room into a sensory room and renovation of the stage to include lighting and sound! Very exciting!

Admissions - Apply for a Reception place for September 2024

If your child turns 5 between 1st September 2024 and 31 August 2025 and you require a school place for September 2024, you can now apply for their place.

The application window will be open from **Monday 6th November** and the closing date for applications is **Monday 15th January 2024.** Applications can be made quickly and easily through the Nottinghamshire County Council Admissions Hub.

Please also remember to submit a Supplementary Information Form if you wish for a school place to be considered under a faith criterion. Please note that you **must** include the supporting evidence with this form. If you are unable to locate the required faith evidence, please contact the parish where your child was baptised in good time for a 'copy' certificate to be supplied.
