globalisation	a more connected world due to the movement and integration of goods and people among different countries, which is driven by international trade and aided by information technology.
trade	the buying and selling of goods and services.
food miles	the distance food has travelled to get to your plate.
TNC (transnational corporations)	as a result of globalisation, some corporations, or large companies, now operate in more than one country.
communication	the act of giving, receiving, and sharing information
transportation	general word for all the methods people use to move themselves and their goods from one place to another
working conditions	the physical and psychological conditions that workers are exposed to while working.
cultural exchange	when people of two or more different backgrounds trade ideas, feelings, stories and customs
technology	the use of knowledge to invent new devices or tools
interconnected	to connect with one another
internet	a network, or system, that connects millions of computers worldwide
environment	All the physical surroundings on Earth
labour	practical work, especially when it involves hard physical effort
