For parents/carers of pupils in Year 6, the time has arrived for you to apply for a secondary school place. It is absolutely essential that all applications are made to your home Local Authority by the national closing date of **Thursday 31st October, 2024.** Nottinghamshire applications can be made here. For the overwhelming majority of you who will be applying for a place at All Saints', please note that you must complete a Supplementary Form from All Saints' as well as the Local Authority application

form. Information on admissions to All Saints' can be found here: https://www.allsaints.notts.sch.uk/information/admissions/.

If you are having any difficulties, please speak to a member of the office team, Mrs Smedley or Mrs Pyatt who will be only too happy to help. It is important to note that if a late application is made, then this will not be considered until all other applications have been allocated; this means you may not be allocated a place in your preferred choice of school. Parents are notified of which school is

assigned on **3rd March**, which is National Offer Day.
