Above 97%	Above 97%. Less than 6 days' absence a year: Excellent attendancel Pupils with this attendance should have access to the majority of the taught curriculum.
95% and below	95%. Less than 10 days' absence in a year: Attendance needs to improvel Pupils with this attendance are likely to access the majority curriculum but will miss out on important educational experiences.
90%	90%. 19 days' absence over the year: Pupils with this attendance are missing 1 month of school per year and will miss key curriculum areas; it will be difficult for them to achieve their best.
85%	85%, 29 days' absence in a year: These pupils are missing <u>6 weeks</u> of school per year it will be very difficult for them to access the curriculum and achieve their best.
80% or below	80%. Pupils with this attendance are missing the equivalent of <u>1 day for every week</u> of school. It will be almost impossible to access all of the curriculum.

Please see the admissions information below regarding applying for a place in school for September 2025.

Applying for a place in school for an F2 place.

If you live in Nottinghamshire and **require a school place for your child in September 2025**, you will contacted by Nottinghamshire County Council with further information and their Admissions form which must be completed so an F2 place can be allocated.

If you do not receive any information from Nottinghamshire County Council, please call the Admissions Team on this number: 0300 500 8080.

If you are applying on faith grounds you will also need to complete our supplementary form which is available from the school office or via school website.

An allocation of a place in Nursery does not grant a place in Main School.

All applications must be made via Nottinghamshire County Council.

First admissions dates to remember:

Children starting school for the first time. Relevant age group: Reception: children born between 01 September 2020 and 31 August 2021

National open date for applications: 4th November 2024

National closing date for applications: 15th January 2025

It is extremely important that you complete your application on time.

Applications received after the closing date will be ranked and considered as late applications.
