Jubilee 2025 - Pilgrims of Hope



2025 has been designated as a Jubilee Year by Pope Francis. We are all invited to enter into a special year of forgiveness and reconciliation, strengthening our relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation. We have a wonderful opportunity to celebrate our Catholic faith during Jubilee 2025 - and we can do this in a variety of ways.

Today we have launched in school the start of the Jubilee year. The theme for the Jubilee year is **Pilgrims of Hope** - and we are those pilgrims. Pope Francis has invited Catholics to renew their hope and discover a vision that can "restore access to the fruits of the earth to everyone".

This special logo has been created which is full of significance.

The cross of Christ is that hope cannot ever be abandoned because we are always in need of it, especially in the most difficult moments.

The Cross, in the shape of a sail, is transformed into an anchor that imposes itself over the waves in motion. A universal symbol of hope.

The rough sea is a reminder of the difficulties of the pilgrimage of life. Often personal events as well as those of the world, press on us more intensely demanding a greater hope.

The figures represent humanity from the four corners of the world. They are embracing each other to illustrate the solidarity between the peoples, as the first holds onto the cross.

Throughout the day, children have taken part in activities which have explored the trust-based themes of the Jubilee Year. They have created 'Jars of hope' and develop displays in the classrooms.

The 6 themes chosen by the trust are:

Care for creation

Forgiveness and Reconciliation

Justice and peace

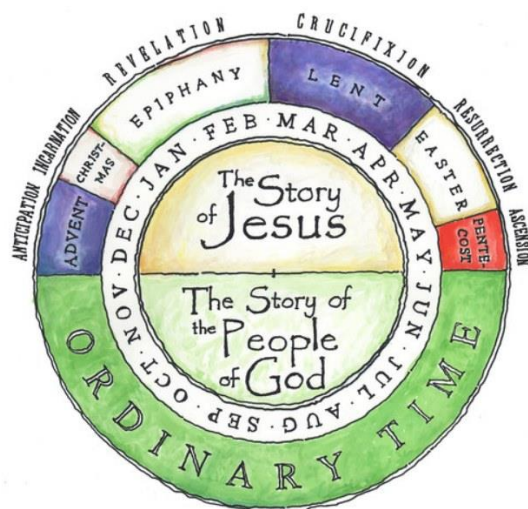
Pilgrimage

Below is a table of how school absence could affect your pupil's ability to access the curriculum.

Above 97%	Above 97%. Less than 6 days' absence a year: Excellent attendance! Pupils with this attendance should have access to the majority of the taught curriculum.
95% and below	95%. Less than 10 days' absence in a year: Attendance needs to improve! Pupils with this attendance are likely to access the majority curriculum but will miss out on important educational experiences.
90%	90%. 19 days' absence over the year: Pupils with this attendance are missing <u>1 month</u> of school per year and will miss key curriculum areas; it will be difficult for them to achieve their best.
85%	85%. 29 days' absence in a year: These pupils are missing <u>6 weeks</u> of school per year, it will be very difficult for them to access the curriculum and achieve their best.
80% or below	80%. Pupils with this attendance are missing the equivalent of <u>1 day for every week</u> of school. It will be almost impossible to access all of the curriculum.

At St Patrick's, we have high expectations for reading as we know that research shows pupils who read for pleasure have a higher academic success across the curriculum.

We also know that the more fluently a child can read the more pleasure it is for them to read. The only way to improve reading is through consistent practice.

Our expectations

At St Patrick's we expect all children to read 4 times a week (in addition to the reading they do at school); however, we always strive for all children to be reading for 20 minutes daily at home.

Recording and monitoring reading

Children must record all reading in their reading diary, which should travel to and from school daily (or as directed by your child's class teacher). We ask that children in KS1 have all reading signed off by an adult (including the date, book title and a comment). We encourage KS2 children to do this independently, but we kindly ask for your support and monitoring of this at home. A member of staff will check reading diaries every Monday. It is important that we can monitor reading, so if your child does not have their reading diary in school every day or does not record reading regularly, the class teacher may be in touch to find ways to support with this.

Rewarding reading

- If your child has read 4 times in the week and recorded it in their reading diary, they will receive a sticker to go on their bookmark, as well as a golden ticket to go on the class recognition board.
- For every 3 stickers they receive (a full row on the bookmark) they will choose a prize from the class Reading Wow Box.
- When a full bookmark is complete, children will receive a reading badge to wear on their tie as well as a reading certificate
