- Listing only one preference may reduce your chances of securing a place at your preferred school.
- If You Are Applying for a Place at St Patrick's:
 - Attendance in our Nursery does not guarantee a Reception place you must apply through the local authority.
 - If you would like your child to be considered under a faith criterion, please complete
 and return a Supplementary Information Form, along with supporting faith evidence.

 - If you do not have your child's baptism certificate or faith evidence, please contact the parish where your child was baptised to request a copy in good time.

Y5/6 Notts police visit and E - safety workshop

We are pleased to share that our Year 5 and 6 students recently participated in an engaging e-safety workshop delivered by local police officers. This informative session provided valuable insights into the world of online safety, focusing on crucial topics such as bullying and the importance of recognising what is right and not right in digital interactions. The officers encouraged our students to think critically about their online behaviour and to be aware of the potential risks they may encounter.

During the workshop, children learned practical steps to take if they come across something concerning online. They were reminded that it's always okay to talk to a trusted adult if they feel uncomfortable or unsure about something they see. The session was not only

educational but also fostered an open dialogue about the challenges of navigating the digital world. We believe that equipping our students with these essential skills will help them make safer choices online.
