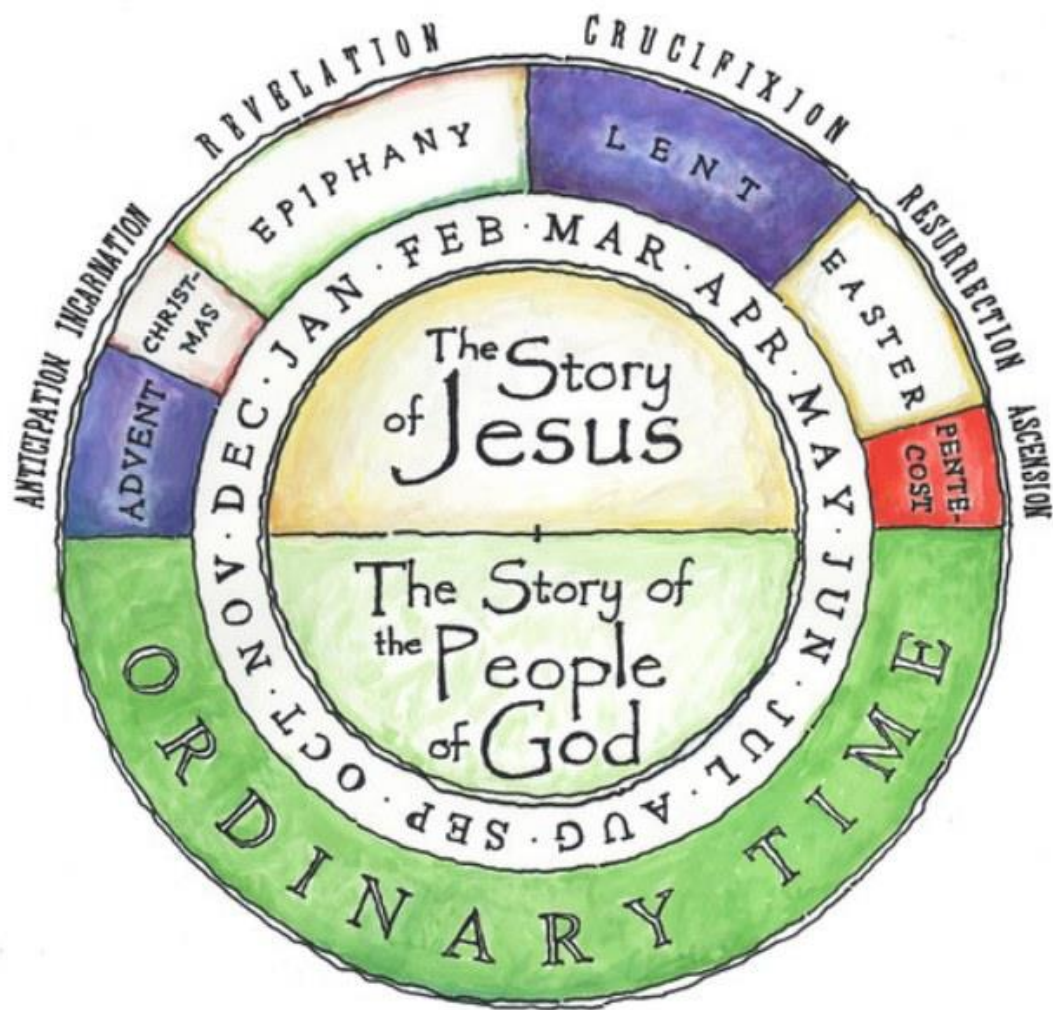

## Pupil Premium Grant

Pupil Premium Grant For those of you unaware, the government provides a Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) for eligible families which provides additional money for schools to use to

improve educational outcomes for our children. Not only does PPG funding help schools, but it also benefits parents too as it entitles you to:

- Free school meals;
- Free milk;
- Trips and residential visits subsidised where 50% of costs are paid by school;
- Participation in after school clubs subsidised by 50%;

Checking your eligibility is easy and takes just a couple of minutes. Login to Nottinghamshire County Council's Synergy Hub, simply enter your National Insurance Number, Date of Birth along with your child's details and the system will inform you if you are eligible. The Local Authority will then inform school which will enable us to offer you the above subsidies. Children attending maintained nurseries (which ours is) can also qualify.

## NSPCC Speak Out. Stay Safe. Programme

We are pleased to inform parents and carers that this term our school will be taking part in the **NSPCC's Speak Out. Stay Safe. programme**.

Speak Out. Stay Safe. is a child-friendly safeguarding programme for children aged 5–11. It aims to help children understand what abuse is, recognise the signs of abuse in all its forms, and know how to speak out if they are worried. Children are encouraged to talk to a trusted adult or contact **Childline**, a free and confidential service.

The programme is fully aligned with the curriculum and includes:

- Age-appropriate **virtual assemblies**
- **Classroom-based follow-up activities** reviewed by school staff
- **Face-to-face workshops led by trained NSPCC volunteers** for specific year groups

The content is delivered in an engaging and interactive way, supported by the NSPCC mascot **Buddy**, and discusses different forms of abuse, including emotional abuse, sexual abuse, neglect, physical abuse and bullying.
